Moments captured by Saveclip are timestamped and automatically uploaded via Wi-Fi or through an iPhone/iPad app to secure cloud storage. Once stored, the images are automatically organized and can be browsed in a Activities format. Integrated with Savespace, these moments become part of your searchable digital memory, naturally connecting with the app's search and Q&A features.

Saveclip is equipped with a manual shutter button. No need to take out your smartphone—just press the button while wearing it to instantly capture that special moment.

Each package includes the Saveclip, Saveclip Strap, and a quick-start guide. The device requires the latest version of the iOS/iPadOS Savespace app. Shipping is scheduled to begin in Spring 2026.
